NOTE FOR GROUP MEMBERS PARTICIPATING ON THE OPTIONAL TURKEY PRE-TRIP: On October 21, 2022, when you check in at O'Hare International Airport for your flight to Turkey, YOU MUST CHECK YOUR LUGGAGE THROUGH TO IZMIR, TURKEY. It's here! We're coming to the Holy Land....

Please note the materials and information accompanying your **Participant Pre-Departure Package**: round trip airline flight itinerary, list of passengers traveling with you as a group, day-to-day suggested sites itinerary, site specific scriptural reference, hotel details, and important contact information. We will distribute **Participant Gift Packages** to each of you at the **October 2, 2022 Pre-Departure Orientation**. Your gifts are designed for your travel comfort and convenience. Please, use the passport and travel document holder we provide as your Participant Gift Package to help keep your passport and important papers together. Use the luggage tags and handle grippers, too. Bring your nylon bag for carrying lightweight belongings during the touring day and bring your hat and wear it, too! It will protect you from the sun and the heat and likewise identify group members across crowded touring sites.

We'd like to share some **last-minute travel suggestions – hints and tidbits** we've learned through our years.

Travel documents, your flight itinerary, your passenger manifest, your passport, travel insurance policy...We suggest making a copy to carry with you, another copy to pack and keep separate from your daily belongings, and a copy of your travel documents to leave at home with family and friends.

Any medication you may be bringing...please keep a list of your medications and dosage with you, and leave your medication in their original bottle or a smaller well-marked container. Leave a list at home with family and friends.

The fall season in Israel does not typically include rain. If you'd like to bring a small travel-size umbrella just in case it rains, please do so. The Jewish High Holy Day season will conclude on October 18, 2022, at which time prayers for rain are recited each day during worship services. If it should rain while we are traveling through the Holy Land, we consider this to be God's blessing and witness that our prayers are being answered.

Cellphone – if you have a Sim card, bring it with you. If you need a 'key' for your cell phone to open the 'drawer,' remember to bring this with you as well. Otherwise, make arrangements for global cell phone service with your cell phone provider.

You can bring your laptop, ipad, etc. with you on the airplane. Remember to flip the switch to 'Airplane Mode' once the flight attendant announces that passenger can use approved electronics.

The electric current in Israel is 220-240 volt electrical input. We'll provide you with an adapter for your electronics.

Israel-only Group Members

On Monday, October 24, 2022, you are traveling as a group member, and as such, **you must present your** passenger manifest and flight itinerary upon check-in at the Turkish Airlines ticket counter in Terminal 5 at Chicago's O'Hare International Airport in order to receive your boarding pass. Plan to arrive no later than 5:40p CT.

You will receive your passenger manifest along with information relevant only to you at the Pre-Departure Orientation on October 2, 2022 immediately following worship service at Journey Church. These documents verify your identity and associate you with the ticket being held in your name with a distinct and unique participant ticket identification number. These documents will contain your ticket number which you will need in case of a travel emergency on the day of travel, or to help the airlines find your reservation. Please print the documents and leave a copy of these documents at home with family and friends. Thank you.

Participants requiring special airport ground services, please notify our office IMMEDIATELY, BY OCTOBER 7, 2022. Participants requiring a special meal request aboard your flights, please notify us IMMEDIATELY, BY OCTOBER 7, 2022. **OUR OFFICE PHONE: 847-835-0550 AND 847-835-3050.**



IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING YOUR PASSPORT AND PASSENGER MANIFEST

Positive identification is required for airport check-in. The name on your passenger manifest must match **EXACTLY** as the name on your passport; if your name does not match exactly, notify our office immediately: 847-835-0550. Your passport must be valid at least through May 31, 2023. When you receive your flight itinerary and passenger manifest, please review the documents and ensure that you understand allowances, restrictions, dangerous goods prohibited onboard or packed in your suitcase. Please check Turkish Airlines' website for information on baggage allowances and restrictions. https://www.turkishairlines.com. You are allowed only one large-size piece of luggage weighing no more than 50 lbs to check, one carry-on weighing no more than 17 lbs to keep with you during the flights, and one small personal bag or purse. In order to comply with the motorcoach configurations and storage area in the bus luggage hold, we ask that you respect these luggage dimensions and weight requirements.

- FOR TRAVELERS VISITING TURKEY, BRING THE COPY OF YOUR VISA TO ENTER TURKEY.
- BRING YOUR MANDATED TRAVEL INSURANCE DOCUMENTS WITH YOU.
- BRING INFORMATION VERIFYING THAT YOU HAVE PURCHASED TRAVEL INSURANCE THAT COVERS YOU FOR COVID-19 AND/OR ITS VARIANTS AND INCLUDES COVERAGE FOR QUARANTINE
- IF YOU HAVE BEEN VACCINATED, BRING YOUR VACCINATION CARD WITH YOU

SUGGESTED SITES ITINERARY

Pending weather, time, conditions, and pace of tour group members

Day 1 - Monday, October 24, 2022 - Depart USA

Depart USA for Tel Aviv. Dinner and breakfast are served during the flight.

Day 2 – Tuesday, October 25, 2022

Arrival in Tel Aviv

We arrive in Israel at Ben Gurion Airport near Tel Aviv. After brief airport formalities and baggage claim, we meet our guide and are escorted to our waiting motor coach. We proceed directly to our hotel in Netanya for check-in, dinner, and overnight.



Day 3 - Wednesday, October 26, 2022

Caesarea / Akko Crusader Museum / Megiddo / Magdala / Tiberias

We begin the first full day of our spiritual journey in the Holy Land by traveling north along the Mediterranean Sea to visit Caesarea, the ancient seaport built by Herod the Great. Paul was imprisoned here and this was the site of Peter's first Gentile convert. Then we visit the ancient city of Akko. The remains of the Crusader town, dating from 1104 to1291, lie almost intact, both above and below today's street level, providing an exceptional picture of the layout and structures of the capital of the medieval Crusader Kingdom of Jerusalem. We continue to Megiddo with its 24 layers of civilizations. This was Ahab's chariot city and one of the most strategic crossroads of the world in Old Testament times. After, we drive to Magdala, hometown of Mary Magdalene, a once prosperous fishing village with its 1st century synagogue, where, in greatest likelihood, Jesus may have taught; as the Bible tells us, Jesus taught in synagogues along the Sea of Galilee. Then on to Tiberias for dinner and overnight at our hotel located in Tiberias.

Day 4 - Thursday, October 27, 2022

Boat Ride on Sea of Galilee / 2,000 year-old boat at Yigal Alon Museum / Banias (Caesarea Philippi) / Capernaum / Mensa Christi / Mount of Beatitudes / Katzrin / Mitzpe Shalom / Yardenit for Baptismal service on Jordan River

After breakfast, we will enjoy a time of praise and worship as we sail on the Sea of Galilee. Following, we will visit the Yigal Alon Museum at Kibbutz Ginossar and its ancient 2,000 year old boat dating to the time of Jesus. Then we visit the Banias, Caesarea Philippi. Jesus and His disciples were here when Peter made his remarkable confession that Jesus was the Messiah (Matthew 16:13-20). Onward to Capernaum (Kfar Nachum), the center of Jesus' ministry, where we visit the ruins of an ancient synagogue from the 4th century AD. We will then visit Mensa Christi, the "Table of Christ," where the resurrected Jesus prepared bread and fishes over a fire for His disciples. Next, continue to the Mount of Beatitudes. From this location, it is believed that Jesus delivered the Sermon on the Mount. Time permitting, via Katzrin, the modern capital of the Golan Heights, a nice town, we stop at Mitzpe Shalom, an observation point overlooking the entire Sea of Galilee and the entire Galilee region. Take the curvy road of Chamat Gader to Yardenit, the baptismal site. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Tiberias.

Day 5 - Friday, October 28, 2022

Beit She'an / Gilgal / Ein Gedi / Lunch at Vared of Jericho / Qumran / Dead Sea Swathe / Dead Sea

We travel through the Jordan Valley to Beit She'an, one the ancient cities of the Decapolis dating from the 5th century B.C., now the site of the largest archaeological excavations in Israel. Continuing to Gilgal, we visit the place where Joshua and the Israelites landed after they crossed the Jordan River into the Promised Land. The site is located on the east side of Jericho (Joshua 4:19-20). Joshua set up 12 stones in this area to commemorate the crossing of the Jordan. Afterwards, enjoy a hike in the nature preserves and waterfalls of Ein Gedi where King David hid from Saul. Next, we visit Qumran, the location where the famous Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered by a shepherd boy. It is here, that the entire Book of Isaiah was found in one of the many caves in the area. We will spend this night at the Dead Sea - the lowest point on earth, where we can swim and enjoy the therapeutic properties of the saltwater without the possibility of sinking. We will check into our hotel, perhaps deciding to enjoy spa treatments or to relax at the pools or to take a dip in the Dead Sea. Dinner and overnight at our hotel at the Dead Sea.

Day 6 - Saturday, October 29, 2022

Enjoy a leisurely early-morning swim at the Dead Sea before heading to Masada where we ascend by state-of-the art cable cars to visit the mountaintop palace of Herod the Great and the great fortress. It is here that the Jewish defenders, from AD 70 – 73,



took their last stand against Rome. View the fascinating remains of Herod's palace, storehouses, cisterns, and an ancient synagogue. Next we visit Kfar Hanokdim where we participate in the Bedouin desert experience - living in the desert, just as our forefathers did thousands of years ago. Onward to Tel Be'er Sheva, the remains of the biblical town of Beer Sheva, mentioned in Genesis when Abimelech and Abraham swore an oath beside a well. Drive to the Ela Valley, best known as the place described in the Bible where the Israelites were encamped when David fought Goliath (1 Sam. 17:2, 19). Continue upward to Jerusalem, for dinner and overnight at our hotel overlooking the Judean Hills surrounding the Holy City.

Day 7 - Sunday, October 30, 2022

Our first daylight view of the Holy City will be from Mt. Scopus, where we will have time to reflect. We begin our first day in Jerusalem at the Mount of Olives, with an outstanding view of the Old City walls and the Eastern (Golden) Gate. From there we descend by foot on the "Palm Sunday Road" to the Garden of Gethsemane for a service in the Garden with time to reflect in this lovely setting . . . olive trees, perhaps 2,000 years old, still stand today. We travel around the Old City walls, viewing the tombs of Absalom and Zachariah and continue to the House of Caiaphas where Jesus was held the night before His crucifixion. Here we will stand on the same stone steps Jesus would have walked up Mount Zion. We then go to visit The Upper Room (Room of the Last Supper) and have a brief service. After lunch, we walk through the Cardo, the bustling heart of ancient Jerusalem. then visit the Western Wall (the Kotel) where we may place our prayers snuggly in the crevices of this Holy Wall. We then begin our visit to the Western Wall Rabbi's Tunnels where we come to an area considered to be the nearest to the Holy of Holies. We proceed to the Pool of Bethesda and the Church of St. Anne, where we can sing in a church with a 10-second echo! We leave the Old City through the Lion's Gate. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Jerusalem.

Day 8 - Monday, October 31, 2022

Jerusalem / Bethlehem / Shepherd's Fields / Church of the Nativity / Lunch in Bethlehem / Yad VaShem / View the Knesset / Shrine of the Book and Dead Sea Scrolls / Scale Model of Ancient Jerusalem

Today, we travel the short distance to Bethlehem. There we will view the Shepherd's Fields and tour the Shepherd's Caves and the 1,600 year-old Church of the Nativity. We will have time to shop and see the famous olive wood carvings, a specialty of the Bethlehem artisans. After lunch, we will return to Jerusalem. We proceed to Yad VaShem, the memorial to the six million Jews who perished during the Holocaust. Following, we drive through modern Jerusalem, viewing the Knesset, seat of the Israeli Parliament, then go to the Shrine of the Book where the Dead Sea Scrolls are displayed and visit the amazing scale model of Jerusalem at the time of Christ. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Jerusalem.

Day 9 - Tuesday, November 1, 2022

We start today with an amazing tour of the City of David. We then re-enter the Old City to visit the Davidson Museum and the Southern Steps to the Temple Mount. Continuing, we visit the Western Wall (the Kotel) where we may place our prayers snuggly in the crevices of this Holy Wall. We then begin our visit to the Western Wall Rabbi's Tunnels where we come to an area considered to be the nearest to the Holy of Holies. We go to the Lithostratos, where we view the actual Jerusalem streets upon which Jesus would have walked, the remains of Pilate's Judgment Hall, and the Ecce Homo Arch. We then walk the Via Dolorosa, passing through intriguing markets and bazaars and visit the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, believed by many to be the place of Jesus' crucifixion and burial. This afternoon we visit the Garden Tomb, which is considered the highlight of our tour! There we will worship and celebrate communion beside the empty tomb. "He is risen; He is not here!" What a wonderfully meaningful conclusion to this truly memorable day! Farewell dinner at a restaurant. Prepare for early-morning flight to USA. Overnight at our hotel in Jerusalem.

IMPORTANT THINGS TO REMEMBER

BRING YOUR PASSPORT

Leave two copies of your passport, airline tickets, and your hotel and contact information with your family and friends. Pack an extra copy of these important documents in a separate area of your luggage.

BRING CASH IN SMALL BILLS

Suggested minimum \$400 dollars for shopping, small souvenirs, water for purchase in your motorcoach in bills no larger than \$20.

WEAR COMFORTABLE WALKING SHOES

We suggest good, sturdy, comfortable walking shoes with rubber soul.

BRING YOUR BIBLE

We are walking through the Bible scroll, touching sites and sounds that are thousands of years old. The Bible is your best 'guide book.' Please, bring it with you. The stories of the Bible will never be the same once the pages have touched the soul of the Land of Israel with its legacy waiting for us to inherit.



When calling Israel from the USA, please dial the international calling code + country code + area code (omit dialing the "0" before the area code if there is a "0") + the 7-digit phone number.

When calling Israel from within Israel, as a local call, dial "0" before the area code + the 7-digit phone number

We suggest **downloading WhatsApp** on your cellphone before you depart the US.
WhatsApp-to-WhatsApp calls are free so long as both parties have downloaded WhatsApp.
Minyan Captains and Bus Captains – to be assigned – and all group members – can stay in touch with one another, easily and comfortably. Please make sure to keep your phone charged each night in your room, or use the WiFi USB ports on the deluxe motorcoach taking us from site to site.

WHAT TO PACK? WHAT TO WEAR? HOW TO PREPARE?????

Temps in Israel in October: Daily high: 76F – 88F; Evening/Night: 56F – 66F (it's been unseasonably warm) October is one of the best months to visit Israel – not too hot, not too cold.

Everyone's body temperature adjusts differently to climate changes. Given the typical temperature and weather in Israel during October, we suggest bringing a light-weight jacket or sweater to keep with you in case the bus is cold. Many of the sites we are visiting are outdoors, yet, still, we visit sites indoors and their air conditioning may be a bit cool for you. If you're into layering, our motto: Layer up and dress down. You may start the day wearing a jacket or sweatshirt, and by late-morning start to peel your layers for maximum comfort. We provide a suggested list of comfortable clothing and 'extras' to consider packing, keeping in mind that when visiting holy sites, modest attire is necessary. You may be asked to cover up if you're wearing shorts and sleeves that are too short or too revealing.

I HAVE A FEW QUESTIONS...

Do I need a visa to enter Israel? No. Citizens of the US do not require a visa. Entry is always at the discretion of the airport customs and security personnel; always behave courteously; if there is an issue, let us know. Upon clearing passport control, you will be handed a slip of paper; this is your entry visa. You must carry it with your passport at all times. You may be asked to present your visa when checking in to your hotels. Do not lose this visa; you are required to present this visa when exiting Israel.

For group members participating on the Optional Turkey Pre-trip, you must complete an online form to obtain your Turkey entry visa. Access the form via this link: https://www.evisa.gov.tr/en/.

Can I bring my laptop? ipad? Tablets? Yes, and bring necessary cables for your gadgets. **Cellphone?** Check with your cellphone provider for service in Israel. Make arrangements with your cellphone carrier to include phone and/or WiFi and date features and packages while you're traveling.

Can I use my credit card in Israel? Yes. Ask your credit card company if they charge for overseas transaction fees. You may want to check with credit card companies that do not charge transaction fees or conversion fees. Israel's currency is the shekel. Currently the exchange rate, as of September 30, 2022, is 1 shekel or NIS (New Israeli Shekel) = 0.28 USD, or 28 cents.. Advise your credit card company in advance that you will be traveling overseas and that you plan to use your card overseas, otherwise they might block activity on your credit card while you're away.

What about camera equipment? Sure, it's up to you. Most cellphones do take great pictures, though.

What's the electrical current in Israel? 220 volts AC; Israel Advantage Tours, Inc. provides an adapter to each Participant.

What about a transformer? If you're plugging in an appliance that was built for 220 volt electrical input, or an appliance that is compatible with multiple voltages, then an adapter is all you need. Otherwise, if the appliance or gadget requires more electricity conversion than an adapter can accommodate, you will require the use of a transformer. It is not recommended to bring a transformer unless you require the use of certain medical equipment or otherwise. Please check with the airline rules and regulations about transporting a transformer. Electrical gadgets that have dual electricity levers, 110 volt and 220 volt, requires your switching the lever to 220 volt when you're in Israel.

We may not always know their reasons for asking questions or making requests, but we do know that their interest is our travel safety. Thank you for obliging with kindness. Before leaving TSA and other checkpoints en route to your destination, remember to collect all of your belongings, especially those items from your pockets that you must place in smaller bins, including identification cards, your passport, loose papers, your wallet, cell phone, loose change and currency, laptops, cellphones, etc.

In case your luggage gets lost en route to your final destination...

... ensure that your belongings are as safe as possible. We suggest the following:

In your carry-on:

Pack a set of clothing in your carry-on luggage in case your checked luggage gets lost. If packing personal vanity items in your carry-on, note that restrictions exist for carrying liquids in excess of certain amounts. Please check your airline website per luggage requirements and restrictions

Upon arrival at the airport of your final destination:

Be sure to complete a 'lost luggage' form; be prepared to provide information about the hotels at which you will be overnighting. Hotel information has been provided in your pre-departure program.

Your Luggage Tags:

Before you leave home, write your name and cell number (if you plan to have a cellphone with you at your final destination) on your luggage tags and affix one to your checked luggage and one to your carry-on. It's up to you if you wish to include your home address details.

Packing Tip:

If you are traveling with a spouse, friend, or family member, both of you might wish to divide your clothing and personal care items amongst your suitcases so that you're each carrying half of one another's belongings. If one checked piece of luggage gets lost, you'll have some clean clothes in the other piece of luggage to wear in the meantime.



Suggestion for small containers:

Contact lens cases that you're not using for contacts, double as a great small and compact container for creams and ointments, small earrings, etc.

ISRAEL ADVANTAGE TOURS, INC. PARTICIPANTS are each permitted to bring only one checked piece of luggage (airlines' policy to not exceed 50 lbs) due to the size constraint of the luggage-hold on the motorcoach, one carry-on piece of luggage based on the airlines' allowances (not to exceed 17 lbs) and one small bag or purse.

WARNING ABOUT CELL PHONES AND TABLETS

During the flight, if you're leaving your gadget on, you must turn it to 'Airplane Mode' in your Settings; when asked to shut your phone or gadgets completely, please do so.

TRAVEL INSURANCE AND COVERAGE FOR COVID-19 AND/OR ITS VARIANTS AND COVERAGE FOR QUARANTINE

Currently, Israel entry protocol requires that each Participant purchase travel insurance with verifiable coverage for Covid-19 and/or its variants <u>and</u> includes coverage for a quarantine package.

If you have not yet purchased your travel insurance, we encourage you to do so ASAP. Along the way during your travels, you will be asked to present verification of your having purchased mandated travel insurance.

While you can purchase travel insurance from any travel insurance company, please make sure that you understand the terms of your policy and the extent to which you are covered for Covid-19 and/or its variants while traveling overseas. Please make sure to have this documented in writing where the words 'Covid-19" is referenced as being included in your insurance coverage.

If you have not yet purchased your travel insurance which, mandated by the Government of Israel must include coverage for Covid-19 and/or its variants, we encourage you to do so ASAP. The Government of Israel may ask you for evidence of your having purchased such insurance.



While you can purchase travel insurance from any travel insurance company, please ensure that the policy you purchase includes coverage for Covid-19 and/or its variants in the eventuality you contract Covid-19 and/or its variants while traveling overseas. Please make sure that you understand the terms of your policy and the extent to which you are covered for Covid-19 and/or its variants while traveling overseas. Please make sure to have this documented in writing where the word Covid-19 and/or its variants is mentioned.

Please note immediately below, information per the Government of Israel current entry protocol, effective as of March 8, 2022, and furnished by the Government of Israel, Israel Ministry of Tourism. Each participant must be apprised of these requirements for entry to Israel.

ENTRY PROTOCOL

As of March 8, 2022, Israel begins welcoming vaccinated and unvaccinated tourists of all ages. Following, please find highlighting information per entry protocol which may change prior to your travel dates. We continue to monitor the situation and will do our utmost to continue updating you about this ever-evolving entry protocol for Israel and the US.

VACCINATED AND UNVACCINATED FOREIGN NATIONALS

Entry by foreign nationals is open to both vaccinated and unvaccinated travelers of all ages. For entry, all travelers must know about their responsibility to comply with mandated tests and completion of forms; failure to do so may jeopardize their ability to participate on their planned



travel experience, and will likely slow down the pace of the tour for the other members of the group. You must complete a Declaration of Health within 10 days of visiting Israel. Access the entry form via this link: https://corona.health.gov.il/en/flights/.

Entry Statement

All foreign nationals are mandated to complete and submit the form within 48 hours before the flight, the earlier the better. Without a complete form, travelers will not be allowed to board the flight and border control will not let them enter Israel.

Please note: On the Entry Form, to be completed within 10 days prior to your US Departure for entry to Israel, the dates on the form in Israel reflect date/month/year, not month/date, year, as we follow in the US.

Personal Information

You, the traveler, can also fill out this form on behalf of your spouse or children who have visited the same countries as you have in the last 14 days.
